# 2011 Bunchgrass Whispering Owl, Columbia Valley \$25.99

In this Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon blend from Spring Creek and Birch Creek vineyards, razor-sharp green fruits meld with aromas of fig, honeycomb and fresh hay. Vibrant citrus fruits and stone merge with tropical fruits and hints of honeysuckle. Supple fruit tannins support the lengthy finish.

### 2008 Bunchgrass Syrah, Lewis Vineyard, Columbia Valley \$30.99

This 100% Lewis Vineyard Syrah offers an intense nose of lavender and violets as minerality melds with dark berry and pepper flavors in a rich, full palate that extends seemingly indefinitely.

### 2009 Bunchgrass Malbec, Walla Walla Valley \$33.99

This 100% Walla Walla Malbec from Frazier Bluff Vineyard is juicy, vivid, rich and darkly colored, with a nose of white pepper, blueberry, graphite and fig and flavors of plum and licorice linger with cocoa and sandalwood on the evocative finish.

### 2009 Bunchgrass Triolet, Walla Walla Valley \$30.99

A Bordeaux-style blend of 67% Walla Walla Cabernet Sauvignon, 27% Cabernet Franc and 6% Petit Verdot from Dwelley and Frazier Bluff vineyards, this wine presents savory and spicy aromas of graphite and herbs and a hint of eucalyptus highlight the nose.

Rich and alluring flavors of blackberry and kirsch liquor lead to a melding of dark plummy fruits and vibrant acidity which frame the meaty and plush finish.

## 2009 Bunchgrass Cabernet Sauvignon - Walla Walla Valley \$44.99

In this 100% Walla Walla Cabernet Sauvignon aromas of blackberry, black currants, tobacco and mint give way to flavors of black cherry, star anise, and rich earth. Supple tannins, intense dark fruit, and a touch of oak mark the bright and lingering finish. The wine is sourced from Windrow and Tokar vineyards in the Walla Walla Valley.
