

# NZ SECONDARY SCHOOL INLINE HOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIPS 2009

The NZIHA as the National Sporting Organisation (NSO) for Inline Hockey in New Zealand opened tenders for the 2009 NZ National Secondary School Inline Hockey Championships on receipt of tender documentation from the NZ Secondary School Sports Association. Tenders have now closed and as there was only one applicant for the 2009 event, the event will be hosted by the New Plymouth Boy's High School in 2009.

New Zealand Inline Hockey acknowledges the work the Hamilton Devils Inline Hockey Club have done in setting up and hosting this event over the past four years. The event is now firmly established on the annual calendar of Inline Hockey events in New Zealand.

Tenders will be called for again in 2009 for the 2010 event using the process that has been sanctioned by the NZSSSC.

In addition, there is an opportunity for Secondary Schools to also enter teams into the "2008 College Games" being held in Hamilton in December (10th to 14th). This event is only held every four years and coincides with an Olympic year. Information can be found at
