Working hand-in-hand with the grape grower, owner and head winemaker Tom Glase strives to create exceptional, food-friendly wines that are true to the terrior, varietals and vintage, wines with a sense of time and place, and a product of Balboa's core values.

Balboa 2010 Merlot Pepper Bridge \$32.99

Sourced from just five rows of grapes in block 64 of Pepperbridge Vineyard, this merlot is fresh and lively, showing candied red fruits, ripe raspberry jam and gentle hints of loamy earth. It proudly boasts a lush mouthfeel around a core of dark fruits.

Balboa 2010 Estate Syrah \$26.99

This is 100% Syrah from Balboa's estate vineyard. Opening with a bouquet showing floral hints of rose petal and hibiscus with cranberry, pomegranate and cigar box, it also reveals dark fruits, pie cherry and minerality on the palate.
