Performance criteria

1.1 Equipment for abseiling is identified.

Range rope, harness, helmet, karabiner, abseil device.

1.2 Safety systems are explained.

Range equipment checks, safety back-up system, safety instructions.

1.3 Hazards are identified.

Range a minimum of three hazards which may include but is not limited to

- rockfall; dropped equipment; loose clothing, jewellery, or hair.

1.4 Correct body position for abseiling is demonstrated.

Range feet high, legs apart.

1.5 Abseil descents are controlled.

Range control hand remains on the rope; descent is halted midway.

Providers must be accredited by the Qualifications Authority, or an inter-institutional body with delegated authority for quality assurance, before they can report credits from assessment against unit standards or deliver courses of study leading to that assessment.

Industry Training Organisations must be accredited by the Qualifications Authority before they can register credits from assessment against unit standards.
