Range: landowner permission, tangata whenua, responsible behaviour. 1.3 The minimising of human impact on the caving environment is demonstrated. may include but is not limited to - route selection, care of Range: speleothems, graffiti, litter, mud throwing, mud transfer. 1.4 The cave environment is described. Range: may include but is not limited to – speleothem, fauna. 1.5 Personal and group safety is understood and demonstrated. Range: separation, hypothermia, moving through the cave environment. 1.6 Care of the cave environment is demonstrated. Range: may include but is not limited to – management of personal waste.
