


Cullinane College Cross Country Results

Xuzhou #36 Trip

On the 15th of May, Mr Shore and Mr Daignault flew to China to meet with the Principal of our Sister School Xuzhou #2 Middle School. The purpose of this meeting was to further the relationship between the two schools and discuss some of the possibilities that may come from the connection in the future. Cullinane and #2 have been sister schools for three years and this is the first meeting of the Principals and it was very

While in Xuzhou, Mr Shore and Mr Daignault visited a second school, Xuzhou #36 School, where they signed a new Sister School agreement. Cullinane is the first and only school to date that has signed such an agreement with #36. The signing ceremony was attended by the Vice Director of the International Education Bureau, Mrs Cao, who was extremely pleased to welcome Cullinane College into the family of Xuzhou #36. Cullinane has a prior connection with the

school as a number of students visited last August for a three week stay, in which many of our students made new friendships. It was the success of this visit that convinced the Principal, Mr Wu, to offer the Sister School Agreement. Both Chinese schools and Cullinane are looking forward to the new possibilities that these agreements can bring in the future regarding relationships between the two countries.

"It was great, I had a life changing moment" said Ellise Smith a Cullinane College Year 12 student. "I have all my life believed that I would go to Te Whare Wananga Awanuiarangi to study things Maori, but after talking to the Waikato University guy I have completely changed my mind. I liked their subject choices and options to study, scholarships and accommodation. Together it made Waikato much more interesting to me."





Another student Eden Kyle, said the day was fantastic. She gathered heaps of information about various universities and training institutions. Eden found out about scholarships and fees. Fortunately she still has another year before a decision has to be made, but the Careers Expo was definitely useful.
