Deuteronomy 30:10-14; Colossians 1:15-20; Luke 10:25-37

In next week's gospel story Luke has Jesus responding to a question that probably most of us wonder about from time to time: 'Who is my neighbour?' It's interesting that Jesus doesn't answer the question, instead he tells a story.

Most of us know from our reading of Scripture and commentaries we've heard that there was no love lost between the Jews and Samaritans, but few of us understand what was behind the actions of the priest and Levite who both 'passed by on the other side'. When the two pass by on the opposite side of the road, they're not just ignoring someone in need, they're actually complying with their religious obligations. As officers of the temple at Jerusalem, they're forbidden to touch a dead body or come into contact with blood. So, they feel no obligation to fulfill God's command in the book of Leviticus to 'love your neighbour' and help the man lying on the side of the road because they are keeping the temple rule. The Samaritan, on the other hand, isn't limited by the same religious restrictions. He's already forbidden – under pain of death – from even entering the temple! Jesus seems to be suggesting that it is all too easy to be so taken up with religion and its rules that loving our neighbour goes out the door. But Luke's Jesus couldn't be clearer: religious obligations can never excuse us from helping someone in need.

He very clearly agrees with the author of Deuteronomy who, in our first reading next week, reminds us that God's commandments are written into our everyday lives. We don't have to look up to heaven to find out what God wants us to do; we simply have to look around us to see where the needs are. As Pope Francis says: start with the realities of life.
