### \*Next weeks readings SIXTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

Genesis 18:1-10a; Colossians 1:24-28; Luke 10:38-42

One of the things next week's readings invite us to think about is the place of **hospitality** in our lives as Christians. The first reading gives an account of Abraham and Sarah extending hospitality to three travellers at a most inconvenient time – during their siesta. The author of Genesis tells us about the reward Abraham and Sarah receive for the generous welcome they gave the visitors. "Then one said, 'I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son.'" Sarah's barrenness is over. God showers generosity on them just as they have shown it to the three travellers. If we turn to the gospel reading, we'll find a similar example with a different and significant twist to it. Luke centres much of his gospel around Jesus and his disciples travelling from Galilee to Jerusalem, frequently dependent on people's hospitality. Next week, the sisters Martha and Mary offer Jesus a meal as he's passing through their village. While the food is being prepared, he spends the time teaching the disciples who were travelling with him - and here comes the twist to the story. Mary takes advantage of the opportunity to do what Jewish women were not allowed to do – sit among the men and learn from the Rabbi. When Martha complains that her sister is listening to his teaching instead of helping with the cooking, Jesus rewards them for their hospitality by gifting them and all women with something which, in Jewish culture, only men had the right to do. In saying that the *'better part will not be taken away'* from Mary, he was saying that women, like men, could be full disciples, learning, absorbing and spreading Jesus' teaching. For Jesus, and for Luke, the dignity and equality of women as his followers was not to be denied. Just recently, while returning from Armenia, Pope Francis included women among those to whom, he said, the Church should apologise for its failure to mirror Jesus' values. JB Kendall rsj

### OUR LADY

Our Lady is virgin not only before and during, but also for ever after, the birth of Jesus. She is aeiparthenos, 'Ever-Virgin'. This life-long virginity is likewise Christocentric and theo-centric. Mary's consent to divine motherhood springs from 'her total self-giving to God in virginity':  
 Mary accepted her election as Mother of the Son of God, guided by spousal love, the love which totally 'consecrates' a human being to God. By virtue of this love, Mary wished to be always and in all things 'given to God' (Deo donata), living in virginity. The words 'Behold the handmaid of the Lord' express the fact that from the outset she accepted and understood her own motherhood as a total gift of self, a gift of her person to the service of the saving plans of the Most High. And to the very end she lived her entire maternal sharing in the life of Jesus Christ, her Son, in a way that matched her vocation to virginity.

**Pope Francis personally invites youth to the Ecumenical Event on the National Mass.** Pope Francis is known for his desire to build bridges between people of all different religions and traditions. Now, he is asking American youth to come and encounter Christ with thousands (perhaps a million) other youth of various denominations on the National Mall on July 16. The Pope took the time to record a **personal message** asking youth to participate, joining 40 well-known speakers, authors and leaders for a day of unified prayer and worship.




Earlier in the week Jo Gichard has
