125th Anniversary Historical Tidbit

Rev. W.S. Bell of the Congregational American Home Missionary Society held religious services in Kalispell on July 18, 1891 (possible date). On August 2, 1891, a collection was taken up for Rev. Bell amounting to \$5.65. An organ and school supplies were purchased. The Kalispell Sunday School classes were held in the back of the post office building. On September 13, 1891, it was voted to change the name of the Sunday school to the First Presbyterian Sunday School of Kalispell.
