**Spirituality and the Awakening Self - The Sacred Journey of Transformation** by David G Benner

A journey of the evolving or unfolding self, the awakening self. The self that emerges during this journey is larger, more enlightened, and more whole. It is a journey that defines our humanity, and our journey towards our source and union with God.

**Forgotten Among the Lilies – Learning to Love Beyond our Fears** by Ronald Rolheiser

The author explores the debilitating obsessions that often dominate our lives and offers down-to-earth guidance for learning to leave our fears, anxieties and guilt "forgotten among the lilies". A blend of insight, compassion, honesty and humour as we explore freedom instead of anxiety, solitude instead of loneliness, and a generosity of spirit.

**The Great Reformer – Francis and the Making of a Radical Pope** by Austen Ivereigh

Since his surprise appointment in 2013, Pope Francis has emerged as the most talked-about and most revolutionary pope in living memory. This biography describes how this revolutionary thinker became the inspirational figure he is today, and how he will use the power of his position to challenge and redirect one of the world's most formidable religions.
