Paiki Ponga was selected in the Hurricanes U16 Tournament Team.


MATH'S NOTICE:

Calculators in Mathematics Examinations

Students at all levels need their own calculators for examinations, both NZQA Externals and junior examinations, coming up in week 6. The school will not have sufficient calculators to lend to everyone. Juniors should be provided with a scientific calculator, for example a Casio FX82, Mahobe DS, or similar. Calculators such as the Jastek are fine for years 9 and 10, and can be obtained for around \$15 from supermarkets.

Students in Years 12 and 13 Mathematics exams should have a graphic calculator (Casio fx-9750 or similar). The school has a few of these to lend but cannot guarantee this for every student.
