5TH WEEK IN ORDINARY TIME READINGS THIS WEEK:

1st: Isa. 58.6-10 Charity

2nd: 1 Cor.2.1-5 Power of the Spirit **Gospel:** Matt 5.13-16 Light of the World Readings for next week: ; Sir 15.15-20 1 Cor.2.6-10

Gospel: Matt 5.17-37

How often have you heard people criticise Catholics for declining to defend their faith or being unable to speak about it to others? They choose to defer to their priests. Yet, it is important that we are always personally ready to witness to our faith: "Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence." (1 Pet 3: 16) That I do not have a doctorate in theology or Scripture should not be an obstacle. St Paul, speaking to the Corinthians, was aware of the doctrine of the Church and well schooled in the disciplines of Scripture. Philosophy and Rhetoric. Nevertheless, he did not rely on this rather: "My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God." (1 Cor 2: 4-5) Can I identify how I have encountered the power of God? If so I can testify to that even though I am not an expert in any academic discipline.

The Holy Spirit can witness through me: "When they bring you before the synagogues, the rulers, and the authorities, do not worry about how you are to defend yourselves or what you are to say; for the Holy Spirit will teach you at that very hour what you ought to say." (Lk 12: 11-12)

Next Week's Reading: SIXTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR Sirach 15:15-20; I Corinthians 2:6-10; Matthew 5:17-37

Quite a few of us will probably have problems with Jesus' opening statement in next Sunday's gospel reading from Matthew's Sermon on the Mount: 'Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. Amen, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or the smallest part of a letter will pass from the law, until all things have taken place.' What Jesus was referring to was the 613 Laws of Moses.

Most of us probably wouldn't be able to name more than one or two of them, let alone worry about breaking any of them! We have to remember that the Scriptures weren't actually written for us so when we read or listen to a piece of Scripture we need to understand something of the people it was written for. They were Jewish Christians, people who not only recited by heart the 613 Torah regulations, but kept them as well. Their males were circumcised, the family participated in synagogue services every Sabbath, and they didn't eat forbidden meats.

As a Jew, Jesus himself was committed to keeping the Mosaic Laws. He would have agreed with the first line of the Sirach reading: 'If you choose you can keep the commandments, they will save you; if you trust in God, you too shall live. .' But he eventually realised and taught that there was a deeper and more fulfilling way of living in relationship with God: 'Unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.' He was convinced that, if we're serious about God's Kingdom we have to go beyond a mere keeping of rules. That's why in the second half of next week's gospel we'll repeatedly hear: you have heard it was said...... but I say.....' He's telling us that the bare minimum is not enough when it comes to God and God's Kingdom.
