On an international basis, Westlake UMC has been helping plant seeds of hope all over the planet. You heard in worship on January 29 about the great work that Rachael Haning and the UMVIM team did in Ecuador earlier this year. It was truly an honor for me to be a part of the team from the North Coast District that traveled to Cambodia. During our time in Cambodia we participated in numerous educational training sessions with clergy and laity in several villages. We also visited three schools and conducted four Vacation Bible Schools that reached 600 children. Education is a vital conduit for bringing hope to others.



University (AU). In 2017, AU is celebrating its 25th anniversary. Graduates of Africa University are planting seeds of hope throughout the continent. For example, an Africa University alum has established more than 65 United Methodist churches in Malawi. Another graduate works with a Christian relief organization in South Africa, while an additional member of the alumni has helped 200,000 displaced persons in Darfur have access to clean water, medicine, and toilets. Africa University graduates also plant seeds of hope through their work for peace throughout the continent.

Education offers hope to people throughout this world. When Westlake UMC supports educational opportunities in Cambodia and Africa we are planting seeds of hope for generations to come. Thank you for your support of our mission and outreach work locally and around the globe. As we enter this season of reflection, I invite you to prayerfully consider joining in on the mission and outreach opportunities of this local congregation to change the world one life at a time through planting seeds of hope.

2017 Family Study for Lent

The season of Lent is a wonderful time to start weekly family devotions. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday (this year March I, 2017) and lasts forty days (not including the Sundays). Sundays are excluded because those are the days we remember Jesus' resurrection. Every Sunday is a little celebration of Easter and thus a time of joy.

Historically, the Christian church has recognized Lent as a time to bring people closer to God. Individuals and groups engage in Bible study, in mission and service, and in fasting to prepare themselves for Easter.

The 40 days of Lent are symbolic of Jesus' time in the wilderness before he began his ministry. During that time, he was tempted; but he stayed true to God.

ENROLLING IN PART A AND B:

What are the Enrollment periods for Medicare?

Initial Enrollment Period (when you're first eligible and turning 65) is the 7-month period: beginning 3 months before your birth month, the month you turn 65, and the 3 months after your turn 65. IF you are outside of your Initial Enrollment Period and you are eligible for Premium free Part A you may sign up for Part A anytime. If you need to BUY A and or Part B, you can only sign up during the General or a Special enrollment period. Not signing up when you're first eligible you may be subject to a higher premium for late enrollment.

General Enrollment Period: January I-March 31 each year

You can sign up for Part A and/or Part B during January I—March 31 each year if both of these apply: 1) You didn't sign up when you were first eligible and 2) you aren't eligible for a Special Enrollment Period (see below).

Special circumstances (Special Enrollment Periods)

You may be eligible for a Special Enrollment if you or your spouse (or family member if you're disabled) is working and covered by a group health plan based on that work. You may be eligible for an 8-month SEP to sign up for Part A and/or Part B starting when whichever happens first: 1) The month after the employment ends or 2) the month after the group health plan insurance ends, based on current employment ends. Usually, you don't pay a late enrollment penalty if you sign up during a SEP.

Update: East Ohio Conference UMVIM Trip to Liberia (January 26 – February 9, 2017)

Our conference team of six arrived in Liberia at Camphor United Methodist Mission with the goal of providing

some uplifting spiritual hope for the 50 or so teachers and staff there. As usually happens we came away with our own personal renewal in Christ and our Faith commitment.

The staff there as well as United Methodist Mission staffs throughout Liberia have not been paid their salaries since September 2016. The reason is that our World Wide United Methodist church has been conducting a 5 month audit of possible irregularities involving some members of the senior staff of the Annual Conference in Monrovia.

This necessary action has visited untold misery on local teachers and other staff. Lack of food at Camphor Mission seemed evident to some of our team who had been there before. Within this backdrop we focused our relationship building on the staff. After school each day we made sure the adult staff was fed a hearty meal and spent time getting to know each other through adult games, and singing. They took a day to show us their culture with some fun activities also.

This was my first International Mission trip where our exposure was to predominately United Methodist Christians. What a joy it was as we ultimately shared Prayer walks, Foot washing and Communion together. I came away with a tremendous feeling of spiritual renewal and hopefully they did too in spite of their economic condition. Their Faith in God seemed unshaken by the previous five months event and we all prayed it would end soon.

A couple of us also spent several evenings doing plumbing repairs at the Judy Olin UMVIM guesthouse. We then visited several other UMC Mission sites near the end of our trip where we saw more hope and an incredible upbeat attitude among Liberian United Methodists working to make Liberia a better place to live.

The WUMC Mission Committee made a very generous contribution on behalf of the congregation of \$500 to help with one month's salary at Camphor Mission. It was delivered while the team was there and very much appreciated.

H IS FOR CHURCH

Hamsters, heroin, and hunger defined who we are in Christian Education this past month. Seriously. Let me weave this all together for the readers.

Two years ago, following a most delightfully insightful conversation with one of our second graders, Christian Ed decided one of our classes would be even better if they had a class pet. A hamster was procured from a pet shop. The Kubancik family used their animal whispering skills to get said pet ready for mass handling. A naming day vote went so perfectly wrong that a dwarf hamster was named Spike Lilly Taco Humphrey. Each Sunday, Spike went home with a unique Sunday school friend to play and hear bedtime Bible stories for the week. Spike returned on Sundays for class, and traveled home with another friend. By fall, it was clear that Spike was aging and tired of so much handling. Together with their lead teacher, Miss Sue Geringer, the kids planned a marvelous retirement party. There were games, Cheerio based gifts for Spike, and a special lesson about our responsibility to care for God's creatures as well as how God notices even just one small creature. Spike is doing well, and loving Retirement Casa Kuenzer home. Christian Education is fun, listens to our kids, and steals teachable moments wherever offered.

There are a lot of powerful statistics about the heroin epidemic. But names of the overdosed deaths are not just statistics. On Christmas Eve, I received a devastating email from our beloved teacher, Mrs. Janet Hanacek that her former daughter in-law (Carrie Mikuluk) and mother of five of her grandchildren overdosed. This same email suggested perhaps our 4th-5th grade mission address this poison. Carrie died the following day. The days and weeks to follow we spoke carefully to the kids, and corresponded with parents about this epidemic. I was both pleased with the support, and saddened by the number of families with a name not a statistic to share connected to the opiate and heroin plague. In moving forward, we had to find the right partner organization for 10 - 12year olds. Arian May called one day from Ohio Guidestone. She was new to a position and looking for our traditional mission contacts. It was not a call I should

have picked up. It was the kind of call where you take a message, then get it to the intended recipient. A dozen shelter-like organizations were contacted but each "felt" a little "too real" for our young missionaries. On what seemed like a whim, I called back Miss May just to see who she would recommend. I still had her number, and she was so cheerful leaving a message. OhioGuidestone itself, she explained, was just preparing to launch a new all encompassing response to the epidemic. So much for whim, right? Intercession makes this a Romans 8:26 moment, a Holy Spirit moment. Christian Education is applicable, directs children to respond to God's call, and prays for God's help.

WUMC Youth kicked off their third 30-hour famine program on Friday, February 17, at 8:00 AM. Process this. Teenagers capable of eating aisle nine as a postdinner snack volunteer to fast for 30 Hours. There are no fancy gimmicks, no amazing giveaways, and yeah again, there are no snacks. There is simply this opportunity to gather together and learn about life circumstances, impossible choices, and the strength of the human spirit. These lessons amplified by their empty stomachs, and temporary hunger. Powerful moments come as brilliant teens struggle by hour 26 to read aloud, as they sing favorite 11:28 service style songs during their free time, and most certainly as one 6th grader explained how "our spiritual hunger needs to be filled by God and to cram ourselves full with everything else but God leaves us starving too." Christian Education avails opportunities which in turn inspire, and uplift us, and remind us God speaks clearly to us all regardless of our age.


