PALLIATIVE CARE FOR CARE ASSISTANTS

Venue: To be advised when registration is confirmed.

This course is designed to support Care Assistants to deliver improved palliative care to their patients by enhancing their knowledge and understanding of palliative care by exploring a number of topics which include:

- Principles of palliative care
- Understanding pain and other common symptoms
- Communicating with and supporting the dying person, their family and whanau
- Caring for dying residents in the last days of life
- Understanding loss and grief

Dates: This course is run twice yearly and consists of four seminars. These seminars are delivered over two morning sessions.

PALLIATIVE CARE STUDY DAY

Venue: *To be advised when registration is confirmed.*

This study day is for health care professionals with a particular interest in caring for patients with palliative care needs and work in areas that place particular emphasis on end of life issues/palliative care.

Its aim is to increase the knowledge and confidence of attendees on palliative care practice and improving end of life care for people and their families/whanau who are living with a life limiting illness.

The study days are palliative care focused with sessions being delivered from a variety of speakers and specialties with expertise in palliative care. Included is a 1/2 hour panel discussion that gives attendees the opportunity to raise a particular topic/issue related to palliative care for our panel of experts to discuss.

Programme agenda is available two months prior to each study day, covering topics including:

- Symptom management
- Professional standards in a palliative context
- Palliative care focused multicultural awareness

Each study day offers attendees the opportunity to suggest future topics.

FUNDAMENTALS OF PALLIATIVE CARE

(Endorsed by Hospice NZ)

The Hospice New Zealand Fundamentals of Palliative Care is a multidisciplinary education resource aimed at supporting and educating all health professionals who are working with patients and families/whanau requiring a palliative approach.

The modules are:

- Essence of palliative care
- Ethical issues in palliative care
- Introduction to spiritual care
- Communication skills
- Palliative care for people with a chronic illness
- Palliative care for people with dementia
- Pain and symptom management including pharmacology (the pharmacology session is optional)
- Last days of life
- Grief and loss
- Caring for ourselves

The modules are delivered twice per year over three days.

You can choose to attend all learning packages of the full course or pick and choose learning packages that suit your learning requirements.

Note: The *ESSENCE OF PALLIATIVE CARE* is the pre-requisite and introduction to the package. You must attend this learning package prior to attending any others
