- 1.2 The economic impact of tourism on New Zealand is analysed in terms of the New Zealand Tourism Satellite Account.
- 1.3 The economic impact of domestic tourism and international tourism are compared in terms of the New Zealand Tourism Satellite Account.
- 1.4 The economic impact of tourism on New Zealand is compared to the economic value of tourism to the world economy in terms of the respective Tourism Satellite Accounts.
