#### External Exam Entries

Please be aware that over the next two weeks our Year 11-13 students and their teachers will be finalising which External Exams they will be completing in the NZQA External Exams in November. Your child will have a short meeting in class with their subject teacher where together they will decide which External Standards they will be sitting. The teacher and student will sign a summary of those Achievement Standards the student is going to sit. A copy of the summary will be given to the student for them to bring home to you. Please ensure your child presents these summary sheets to you. If you have any concerns about the entries made please either contact the teacher concerned or the year level Dean. Once the entries have been submitted to NZQA we will prepare a full list of all of the External Standards your student is entered for. This will be forwarded to you ASAP.

# NCEA Fees for 2017 are \$76.70 per student. Scholarship fees are additional.

You are more than welcome to make part-payments towards this fee but all NCEA fees must be paid in full by **Wednesday 6th Sept 2017** 

# Financial Assistance is available if parents or caregivers meet one of the following conditions:

- Two or more students are entered for NCEA with fees more than \$200.
- Be receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit.
- Have a Community Services Card.
- Have joint family income that qualifies for a Community Services Card.

In order to qualify for financial assistance, you are required to complete an application form which is available from the Bursar or College office.

### Manukōrero / Paerangatahi 2017

On the 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of June the regional Manukorero and Paerangatahi competitions were hosted at Ratana and Whanganui Jubilee stadium. Sixteen schools from Whanganui and Taranaki competed in the Manukorero Speech competition to qualify for the national Manukorero competition to be held in New Plymouth, during week 9 of term 3. It was a wonderful day at Ratana as over 400 people supported all the speakers who took to the stage. We had four speakers entered into each section; Amber Hammond-Mars (junior English), Caitlyn Huwyler (junior Maori), Macy Duxfield (senior English) and Ellise Smith (senior Maori). All students performed exceptionally well and achieved some great results. Amber and Caitlyn, both first timers to Manukorero, did an awesome job with Amber placing 3<sup>rd</sup> and Caitlyn 1<sup>st</sup> place. In the senior sections; Macy placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in impromptu delivery and 4<sup>th</sup> overall, while Ellise came 1st in both senior Maori impromptu and prepared sections. Cullinane also took the overall trophy for Manukorero gaining the highest points for a school with a speaker in all 4 sections. This was a fantastic result and means both Caitlyn and Ellise will now represent the Whanganui/Taranaki region at the national competition. Special mention also to our own Mrs Tasha Bullock for her work as a judge in the senior English section and all the Cullinane student volunteers and whanau tautoko who worked tirelessly behind the scenes to help Aunty Carol and her team with manaaki tangata and hospitality to the visitors.

## <u>Te Ngakau O Te Awa win Paerangatahi 2017</u>

Following on from the great success of Manukorero, our school kapahaka Te Ngakau O Te Awa once again won the Paerangatahi regional Kapahaka competition. The kapa now qualify to represent the region at next year's national competition in Palmerston North. The final results were most pleasing as the kapahaka team had worked extremely hard this year with a goal of maintaining their status as the top kapahaka team in the region. It was almost a repeat of the 2015 results with the kapa winning all categories except for the Poi where they placed second. Despite this, it was still a great achievement and the standard of performance was a reflection of the results.
