WHANGANUI PARISH BULLETIN ZO AUGUST ZO17 ZOTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Readings for this week: Isaiah 56:1, 6-7; Romans 11:13-15, 29-32; Matthew 15:21-28

The Entrance Antiphon has us sing, "Turn your eyes, O God our shield; and look upon the face of your anointed one; one day within your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere." [Ps 83; 10-11] It reminds us of the privilege given us in our baptism, becoming members of the household of God, those for whom God cares, and for whom the goal of the everlasting joys of heaven is entrancing. The Collect has us pray in part, "that amid the uncertainties of this world, our hearts may be fixed on that place where true gladness if found."

Only after this do we listen to Isaiah telling us that the "foreigners who join the Lord and minister to him, to love the name of the Lord, to be his servants and hold fast to (his) covenant - these I will bring to his holy mountain." [Is 56; 6-7a]

We are those people! The Canaanite woman was one of the few whom our Lord recognised and helped outside the Judeans to whom he was sent to restore the kingdom to Israel. [Acts 1; 6, 13; 46] We are those privileged, to as Isaiah foretold, to go to His holy mountain, the heavenly Jerusalem, and offer sacrifice at His altar. [Hebrews 12; 22-24, 28]

With the Canaanite, we take our place at the Master's table, to be fed as His children. Let us enjoy the privilege and make of our lives a living sacrifice of praise.

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

Isaiah 22:19-23; Romans 11:33-36; Matthew 16:13-20

Next week, listen carefully to the second reading in which Paul heaps praise on God's wisdom and knowledge. "O the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God!" he says. "How inscrutable are his judgments and how unsearchable his ways!" If that's true, how do we recognise God's inscrutable wisdom and unsearchable knowledge at work in every aspect of our daily lives?

The first reading from Isaiah has God completely involved in human life to the point of arranging a change in political power. The writers of Scripture would have been totally bewildered by the way we separate politics and religion. In their understanding, if God was concerned about everything, then God was concerned about **everything** without exception. It might help if we listen to the Gospel next week with a different mindset. We are used to thinking of it in terms of Peter as the first pope but Scripture scholars say that Matthew was really stressing Peter's faith in the risen Jesus and it was on that faith that the Christian community was built – Matthew was focusing on faith, not the person. It's true that, at the end of the reading, Jesus gives the power to bind and loose to Peter but, two weeks' later, if we listen carefully we'll hear him giving that same power to the whole community. Knowing God's will does not rest exclusively in one person, one institution or one situation; we must always be open to seeing it where we have never noticed it before. Pope Francis, in wanting everyone's input into the Vatican's Synod on the Family and the upcoming one on Youth, is certainly acknowledging that the truth of faith rests in the whole community and the task of each of us is to seek it out.
