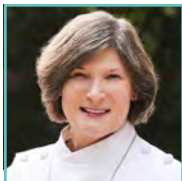

PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

On an annual basis, the senior pastor is required to submit a written report to the Charge Conference. It has been my practice for the past several years to also share the report with the congregation via the church newsletter. By doing so, it is my hope that a culture of transparency is encouraged within the faith community.

PASTOR'S REPORT TO THE 2017 CHARGE CONFERENCE

At the East Ohio Annual Conference in June, Bishop Tracy Malone charged each one of us to bear fruit that will last, and to be bold in our ministry. During this past charge conference year, Westlake UMC has been focused on bearing fruit that will last for many years to come. The impact of the ministries of this church extends well beyond our three worship services each Sunday. We continue to be focused on making and maturing disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world as we boldly move into a new charge conference year.

In the fall of 2016, the Staff Parish Relations Committee, our District Superintendent, and I worked together through the consultation process to develop and approve the following goals for Westlake UMC: *continue to strengthen our administrative foundation; maintain a focus on spiritual formation for the congregation with an emphasis on spirit-led leadership; and execute our missional strategy.* The progress of each of these goals has been assessed in various committee settings and reported on at each Leadership Council meeting during this past charge conference year.

We have strengthened our administrative foundation by updating personnel related tools such as the finalization of job descriptions, the development of a staff performance review process, and addressing pension issues. The staff have been purposeful in growing as

disciples of Jesus Christ through their participation in a book study of *Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations* and in participation in a day retreat that focused on prayer. In addition, two staff members joined me in participating in the North Coast District's Leadership Academy. A significant undertaking in strengthening our administrative foundation has been the work that I have done with the Finance Committee and the Staff Parish Relations Committee on completing a "Life Cycle of the Church" analysis utilizing an objective tool from the West Ohio Conference. This is an important assessment of where our church is focusing our financial resources. Through the use of this tool, we have been, and will continue to evaluate the use of the financial resources of this faith community.

Our second goal for this charge conference year was to maintain a focus on spiritual formation through spirit-led leadership. The Leadership Council completed its study of *Pursuing God's Will Together: A Discernment Practice for Leadership Groups* in early 2017. The practices learned through this study have been integrated into decision-making for all matters related to the church. These discernment practices have also been implemented in our key, decision-making committees within the church. In February 2017, Rev. Dr. Sue Nilson Kibbey came to Westlake UMC to lead a retreat on "Breakthrough Prayer." We have begun the implementation of our own Breakthrough Prayer Initiative. We look forward to the fruit that will come from our focus on prayer.

Lastly, during this past Charge Conference year, the Mission Team began the execution of the strategy that was developed last year for local, regional, national, and international mission. One key area of focus in 2017 was expanding our relationship with Simpson UMC. In the spring, Ellie Peiffer and I were invited by the Simpson UMC pastor to lead a faith formation class at their church, and Rachael Grech, our youth coordinator, led confirmation classes for Simpson UMC youth. During the summer, the newly appointed pastor at Simpson invited our pastoral intern, Mikayla Kovacik and I to lead

a faith formation study there. On October 11, Ellie and I began a new fall faith formation study on Wednesday mornings at Simpson. This study is open to parishioners from both Simpson UMC and Westlake UMC. In addition to our focus on growing our relationship with Simpson UMC, we have had dedicated Mission Sundays during which the missional strategy and its execution have been shared with our congregants. We have also expanded our work in international mission. Three individuals from our faith community traveled to Cambodia to be in mission with local clergy and laity in January. Additional international mission trips were made to Liberia and Ecuador. A joint mission trip between Berea UMC and Westlake UMC is being planned for March 2018.

In the upcoming charge conference year, our goals will be to focus on strengthening our administrative foundation, including working with and empowering staff as models of disciples of Christ. We will maintain a focus on spiritual formation for the congregation and broaden our missional strategy to include greater diversity while also expanding our outreach efforts.

It is hard for me to believe that we are in our third year of ministry together at Westlake United Methodist Church. It continues to be an honor to serve as your pastor. Together, I am confident that our work in ministry together will bear fruit for many years to come as we make and mature disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

Our Flat Rock Christmas Gift Collection is now underway until November 30.

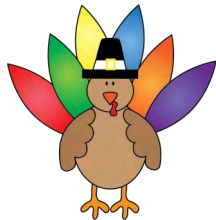

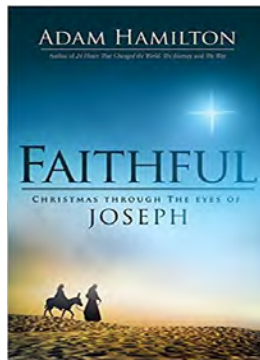

Faithful: Christmas Through the Eyes of Joseph

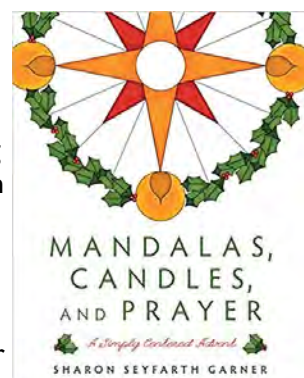

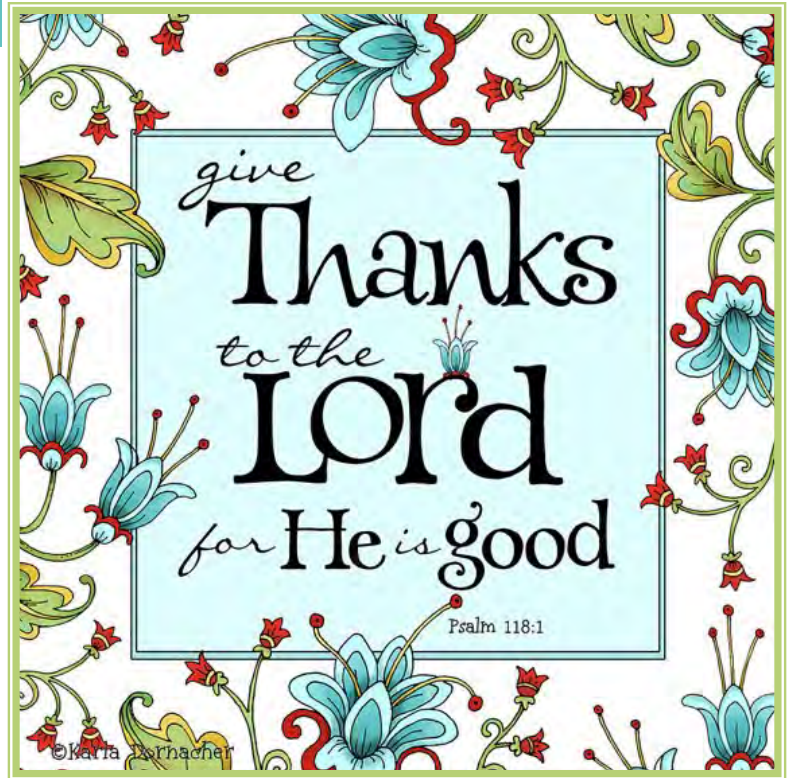
