Guest Speaker

Our guest speaker was Marc Kilmister a corrections dog handler at the Whanganui Prison.

Marc has spent 30 years in the prison service in both Australia & New Zealand, 14 of which has been as a dog handler. His beat includes other prisons including Waikerea and also doing raids on homes.

The biggest success was a raid that netted \$500,000 of drugs and \$1.5 million in cash.

During his time as a dog handler he has worked 3 dogs and is currently training a fourth.

It cost about \$100,000 to train dogs.

Dogs now start training at a younger age, some before they are 5 months old where as previously they did not start the training until the dogs were 12 to 18 months old.

He indicated that the best thing about working with dogs is they don't answer back, they are loyal and they don't lie. But this does not mean that they do not "try you out" if the opportunity presents.

He and his dog must be alert at all times as prisoners associates are always trying new ways to sneak drugs into the prisons. In mail, on people, by them being thrown over the fence, in vehicles and even in the library bus.

Safety of the dogs is important as they cannot risk a dog ingesting drugs after sniffing them out.

Synthetic drugs will become a real problem because their make up is never the same and the smells, as a result, confuse.

Gangs have been known to put a bounty on drug dogs. One that Marc had, had a \$5,000 bounty on its head.

The presentation concluded with our being shown Marc's dog in action easily sniffing out drugs that had been placed on Mark Kennedy who was standing alongside 5 other club members.
