PALLIATIVE CARE FOR CARE ASSISTANTS

PALLIATIVE CARE STUDY DAY

Venue: Hospice Whanganui

This study day is for health care professionals with a particular interest in caring for patients with palliative care needs and work in areas that place particular emphasis on end of life issues/palliative care.

Its aim is to increase the knowledge and confidence of attendees on palliative care practice and improving end of life care for people and their families/whanau who are living with a life limiting illness.

The study days are palliative care focused with sessions being delivered from a variety of speakers and specialties with expertise in palliative care. Included is a 1/2 hour debate between palliative staff on a chosen topic from current issues and challenges in palliative care. The audience will be invited to vote on the subject.

Programme agenda is available two months prior to each study day, covering topics including:

- Symptom management
- Professional standards in a palliative context
- Palliative care focused multicultural awareness

The Hospice New Zealand Fundamentals of Palliative Care is a multidisciplinary education resource aimed at supporting and educating all health professionals who are working with patients and families/whanau requiring a palliative approach.

The modules are:

- Essence of palliative care
- Ethical issues in palliative care
- Introduction to spiritual care
- Communication skills
- Palliative care for people with a chronic illness
- Palliative care for people with dementia
- Pain and symptom management including pharmacology (the pharmacology session is optional)
- Last days of life
- Grief and loss
- Caring for ourselves

The ten modules are delivered over three days by a number of palliative care health professionals.

You can choose to attend all learning packages or pick and those that suit your learning requirements.
