## **Pastoral Reflections**

"Letting the Light Lead You"

"Thank you, God, for reminding me to slow down and let the candle light my way." These

powerful words from the opening story in Rev. Sharon Seyfarth Garner's new book, Mandalas, Candles, and Prayer: A Simply Centered Advent, remind us of the importance of slowing down and taking in the sacredness of the season of Advent as we prepare for the birth of the Christ Child. The idea of slowing our pace as Christmas and the New Year approach sounds lovely. However, if we are honest with ourselves, we all know that our calendars become full of all kinds of events. There are special family gatherings, professional celebrations, friends who have their once-a-year party that you simply must attend, and the calendar invitations go on and on. The list of opportunities to celebrate the season, ones we look forward to and those we feel obligated to do, becomes long and complicated.

Perhaps that is why my friend and colleague's new book about "a simply centered Advent" resonated with me when we began talking about it at Annual Conference this past June. Rev. Sharon and I were sitting together at the North Coast District lunch at Lakeside, and we began a conversation about her new book which was scheduled to be released in the fall. From that moment, I felt the leading of the Holy Spirit to focus the season of Advent at the Westlake United Methodist Church centered in prayer.

Through the leadership of many staff and volunteers, Advent at WUMC will be centered on the weekly themes of hope, love, joy, and peace. These themes will be celebrated in worship, with our children, and in a special intergenerational study of the book, Mandalas, Candles, and Prayer: A Simply Centered Advent. 
## What are Seeds for Scholarships?

## What are you looking for?

The season of Advent is one of anticipation, of waiting for something good. Have you asked yourself honestly what are the things you are waiting for? What are you looking forward to with great anticipation? Maybe it's a new car in the driveway or a home remodeling project? When we make a big purchase or big change we start looking...researching on the internet, talking to experts and friends, and visiting show-rooms. We invest time and attention as we wait and prepare.

Spiritually, it's the same. We know that Jesus's coming at Christmas is Emmanuel...God with us! As we anticipate this wondrously good spiritual reality, we begin to look for God's presence in our lives, we "research" by talking with others; participating in small groups, and sharing devotions. We attend worship to praise and know God. We prepare our hearts with prayer and service to others. We have faith that God is at work and the miracle of Christmas, Christ, is born to us.

As a church we continue to pray each day at 6:10am or pm, with the purpose of opening ourselves and our church to the heart and mind of God.
