From Exodus to Easter: The Importance of Small Things **Pastor Steve & Pastor Walter**

1.) Think of a time when you did or saw someone do something significant for God. Are the first things that come to your mind big or small things? Does something have to be big in order for it to be significant for God?

Read Exodus 2:1-10

2.) Pharaoh's daughter starts the day off like any other, but then finds this Hebrew baby in the reeds at the edge of the river. Given the context, what emotions do you think might be running through Pharaoh's daughter's mind?

3.) Pharaoh's daughter chooses to notice this child and respond. What risks would her response have involved? What was it within her that enabled her to take in Moses despite the risks?

Read John 6:1-9

4.) What small but important things come to your attention in this story?

5.) Throughout his ministry on earth, Jesus was constantly on the lookout, watching. Jesus noticed this boy and received his little gift. What “little gifts” have you offered to God? What did God do with them?

Application

6.) Imagine a gigantic door that swings on a set of relatively tiny little hinges. The entire story of God’s deliverance of the roughly 2 million Hebrews out of Egypt hinges on this brief interaction between the baby Moses and his family and the princess of Egypt. Can you look back and think of a similar “hinge point” in your own story? What were the possible outcomes? How do you see God’s hand in bringing about what happened?
