# WHANGANUI PARISH BULLETIN 4 MARCH 2018 3RD SUNDAY OF LENT



**Readings for this week:** Ex 20:1-17; I Cor 1:18, 22-25; Jn 2:13-25

**REFLECTION ON THE THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT**

In today's Gospel, we are introduced by Apostle John to share in the action that Jesus did as he went up to Jerusalem. Such actions is Jesus's way of showing his frustration and anger at the people who were selling cattle, sheep, and doves in his Father's house which is the temple. Showing his frustration and anger, he throws out the coins of the money changers and overturns their tables and then drives them all out from the Temple.

*Why did Jesus do such actions? What do these actions mean to us in our lives today?*

Surely these actions that Jesus did show how human he is just like each and every one of us. Jesus understands what a temple is and he has the courage to do such things. And nothing can ever stop him from doing what he intends to do. In this case, we are reminded that every action in our day to day life requires both understanding and courage. Without understanding and courage, our actions can become so dry and worthless. However, Jesus's actions are seen oddly by the people in the temple because the temple is meant to be a sacred house, a house for praise and worship. Corresponding to this understanding of what a temple is, Jesus also refers himself as the temple. Apostle Paul in his letter to the Corinthians supports this by telling the Corinthians that 'they themselves are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in their midst. If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for God's temple is sacred, and they are that temple (1 Corinthians 3:16-17).'

For us, individual, family and community of faith, these actions could mean different things. Because we are God's temple, it could mean that we need to throw out all the selfishness and pride we have for ourselves, be humble and drives out all the negative desires we have for ourselves and others. Apostle Paul backs this up in his letter to the Philippians telling them to "do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility (Phil 2:3)." In doing so, every action we are going to do will be worth doing. For us to achieve this we need to take some time this week to learn and reflect on our understanding of ourselves and our faith so that we can have a better and deeper understanding of the mystery of God's passion, death and resurrection throughout this Lenten season. More importantly, let us persistently pray to God in this third week of lent, and ask him to give us enough courage in every actions we do. So that that we do not do it according to our own will but the will of God.

**FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT**

**Next weeks readings:** II Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23; Ephesians 2:4-10; John 3:14-21

Next week the author of Chronicles spells out the problems he's facing in his community. Turning away from God, and worshipping pagan gods in the temple at Jerusalem are just the first examples of unfaithfulness.

But the one which he comes back to repeatedly is some-thing that we might never think of as a transgression: ignoring the prophets in their midst. *"They kept mocking the messengers of God, despising his words, and scoffing at his prophets until the wrath of the Lord against his people became so great that there was no remedy."*

Listening to and obeying the prophets that God continually sent was the accepted way for discovering God's will. Prophets were the 'conscience' of the people.

The difficulty was how to tell the real ones from the fake ones.

Authentic prophets always go back to the origins of faith. In terms of Christian faith they are clear about what is true to and what deviates from the truths and values that Jesus taught.

For instance, the writer of Ephesians reminded his early Christian community that salvation was the result of God's unflinching love, not something they could earn by slavish adherence to rituals and rules - *"By grace you have been saved through faith and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God.....For we are what God has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works."*

If we want to know exactly what those 'good works' are, the 'good works' we are called to, we have only to turn to Jesus with the certainty that, as the gospel says, *"those who do what is true come to the light....[because].....their deeds have been done in God."*
