WHANGANUI PARISH BULLETIN 1 APRIL ZO18 EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF



Readings for this week: Acts 10:34a, 37-43 Colossians 3:1-4 John 20:1-9

In the Gospel reading for the Easter Vigil for Year B Mary Magdalene, Mary the Mother of James and Salome bring spices to the tomb in the morning. They wish to fulfill the ritual requirements of Jewish burials. They did not expect to find an empty tomb.

Ritual is sometimes derided by people who have a great regard for enthusiasm and novelty. Yet, it is sometimes rituals that keep us putting one foot in front of the other as we have to deal with tragedy and grief. This is often the case when we have a bereavement and our brains struggle to deal with what has happened while our emotions are being overwhelmed.

Nevertheless, we hang on in there an do what is asked of us especially when it comes to prayer an the liturgy. The vigil and the Mass take place as the Church prescribes. It is in this moment however, as it was on that Easter morning, that our God is revealed as being truly the "God of Surprises."

It is through the pain, loss an grief that the true value of God's power and risen life in Christ Jesus shines through.

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

Next weeks readings: Acts 4:32-35 | John 5:1-6 John 20:19-31

Have you ever noticed that the Gospel for next Sunday, the second Sunday of Easter, is the same every year? That suggests that what John says about Jesus' resurrection is so important that it should be very much in our minds during Eastertide.

When John's Jesus appears to his disciples on Easter Sunday night the very first thing he says to them is "Peace be with vou."

He then shows them "his hands and his side" reminding them that peace usually comes at a price. The clue to what that price might be comes next when Jesus says: "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

We tend to think that those words refer to the priestly power of sacramental forgiveness but Scripture Scholars are of the opinion that they were never meant in the way we have come to understand them.

They believe that when Jesus said those words he was speaking to all his disciples, not just the apostles. He was reminding them that each of them as individuals and all of them as a community were called to be forgiving people as part of following him in his resurrected life.

Obviously, since it's part of the Gospel, John wanted his community to reflect on the importance of foraiveness.

Perhaps a practical outcome of next week's gospel might be giving some thought to whether we are as ready to be forgiving outside the reconciliation room as we are to receive forgiveness within the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Letting go of the things that have hurt and offended us and being truly forgiving or apologising for our own offences is possibly much more demanding than simply naming things in confession, receiving absolution, and doing nothing to actually put things right.
