



# WHANGANUI HIGH SCHOOL POLICY

## STUDENT ENROLMENT

Policy No: 6.1  
(NAG 6)

<b>INTRODUCTION</b>	1	The Board recognises the fact that community members wish to have their children attend the school of their choice.
	2	The Board also recognises the constraints placed on it by its financial and physical resources.
	3	The Board is also bound by legislation relating to enrolments as detailed in the Education Act, 1989, as amended by the Education Amendment Act 2000.
<b>OBJECTIVES</b>	1	To set clear guidelines on how students might enrol or be enrolled at Whanganui High School.
	2	To ensure the educational needs of students at Whanganui High School are not disadvantaged by having the facilities of Whanganui High School over-taxed.
	3	To ensure those who wish to enrol students at Whanganui High School have a clear understanding of the philosophy of the school, its rules and regulations, and, that in applying to enrol students at Whanganui High School, they, and those being enrolled, accept and adhere to these.
<b>GUIDELINES</b>	1	The Principal has overall authority to accept or decline students wishing to enrol at Whanganui High School, in keeping with the Whanganui High School Enrolment Scheme (see attached) and the terms and conditions of student rights of access to education as laid down by the Ministry of Education.
	2	The Principal will actively promote the school's expectations and procedures for enrolment within the school's community each year.
	3	The criteria for deciding on the acceptance or otherwise of students, are to be applied by the Principal in keeping with the Enrolment Scheme.
	4	The Board is required to review its enrolment scheme annually by 1 May. <b>Note:</b> The enrolment scheme can be re-negotiated within the Ministry of Education at any time. Any change must be advised to the community, e.g. newspaper, as soon as practicable after it has been adopted by the Board of Trustees. Any amendment will take effect on 1 January in the year following its adoption.
<b>CONCLUSION</b>	1	Currently the school's physical resources are limited and to ensure current students are not disadvantaged, the school has adopted an enrolment scheme. Where possible, however, students who wish to enrol at Whanganui High School will be encouraged to do so.
<b>EVALUATION</b>	1	The Board, in association with the Principal, will review this policy annually in accordance with the school's quality management cycle.

## WHANGANUI HIGH SCHOOL

### ENROLMENT SCHEME

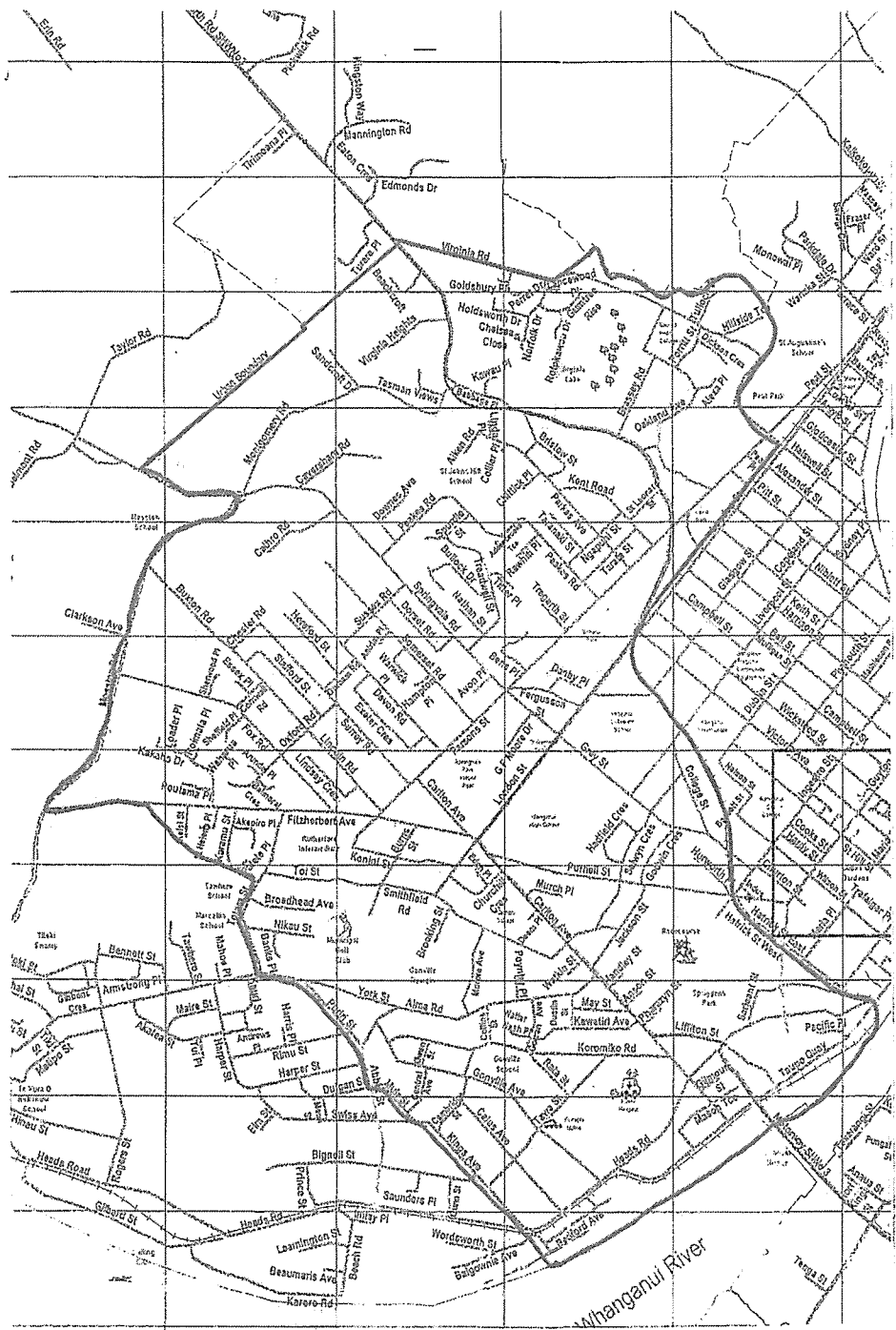
The School's enrolment scheme has been established in association with the Ministry of Education in order to limit the size of the School's roll. There are several criteria associated with this scheme:

#### 1 HOME ZONE

- a) All students who live within the home zone (shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at the School.
- b) Proof of residence within the home zone may be required by the Principal.

#### 2 OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

- a) Each year the Board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the School. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.
- b) Applicants will then be accepted in the following order of priority:
  - i) Applicants who have been accepted for enrolment in special programme(s) run by the school and approved by the Secretary for Education;
  - ii) Applicants who are siblings of current students;
  - iii) Applicants who are siblings of former students;
  - iv) Applicants who have parents who are former students;
  - v) Applicants who are either the child of an employee of the Board of Trustees or a child of a member of the Board of Trustees;
  - vi) All other applicants.
- c) If there are more applicants in categories 2 – 5 than places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.
- d) Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.



## WHANGANUI HIGH SCHOOL ZONE DESCRIPTION

**Inclusive** of all residents inside the area defined with these boundaries. From the north, and working in a clockwise direction:

1	Both sides of Virginia Rd from the corner of SH3, including numbers 32 to 62 through to both sides of Halswell St to the centre of the railway line.
2	The centre of the railway line from Halswell St to its intersection with Taupo Quay, thereby <i>including</i> : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- London St <u>from</u> numbers 173 odd &amp; 178 even onwards</li> <li>- Glasgow St <u>from</u> numbers 151 odd &amp; 152 even onwards</li> <li>- Liverpool St <u>from</u> numbers 93 odd &amp; 122 even onwards</li> <li>- College St <u>from</u> numbers 7 odd &amp; 12 even onwards</li> <li>- Ingestre St <u>from</u> number 190</li> <li>- Hatrick St numbers 23, 25, 33, 36, 38</li> <li>- Guyton St <u>from</u> number 218</li> </ul>
3	The intersection of the railway line at Taupo Quay to the right hand side (downstream) bank of the river at a point which is at right angles to Taupo Quay intersection with the railway line.
4	From the point on the riverbank at right angles to Taupo Quay to a point that is opposite the extension of Kings Ave, thereby <i>including</i> Bedford Ave but excluding Balgownie Ave.
5	City side of Kings Ave (even numbers only) from its extension to the riverbank to the corner of Swiss Ave. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Kings Ave numbers 2 – 48 even numbers only</li> </ul>
6	City side of Swiss Ave (even numbers only) from the corner of Kings Ave to the corner of Muir St. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Swiss Ave numbers 2 – 8 even numbers only</li> </ul>
7	Both sides of Muir St from the intersection with Swiss Ave to the corner of Abbot St. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Muir St numbers 1 – 28 both sides</li> </ul>
8	Both sides of Abbot St from the intersection with Muir St and continuing into both sides of Puriri St to the intersection with York Rd. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Abbot St numbers 40, 40A, 42, 48, 50, 59</li> <li>- Puriri St numbers 1 - 27 both sides</li> </ul>
9	From the intersection of York Rd and Puriri St to the corner of Totara St and Puriri St. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Puriri St numbers 44 – 53 both sides</li> </ul>
10	City side of Totara St (even numbers only) from intersection with Puriri St to the corner of Totara St and Karamu St. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Totara St numbers 2 – 42 even numbers only</li> </ul>
11	From the corner of Totara St and both sides of Karamu St to Mosston Rd at the point that would be the intersection of the extended Fitzherbert Ave and Mosston Rd, thereby <i>including</i> all residential properties on the western boundary. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Including St Helens Pl and Kelsi St</li> </ul>
12	Both sides of Mosston Rd from the intersection of Fitzherbert Ave extension with Mosston Rd to the intersection of Montgomery Rd and Mosston Rd. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Mosston Rd <u>from</u> numbers 110 even &amp; 129 odd onwards</li> </ul>
13	Both sides of Tayforth Rd from the corner of Mosston Rd to the Wanganui Urban boundary line. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Tayforth Rd <u>up to</u> numbers 28 even &amp; 43 odd</li> </ul>
14	From the intersection of the Whanganui Urban boundary line and Montgomery Rd in a straight line to the intersection of Virginia Rd and SH3 (Great North Rd). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Great North Rd <u>up to</u> numbers 148 even &amp; 165A odd onwards</li> </ul>
