PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL TO EVERY ONE

The Lord's Ascension reminds us of our final destination. Jesus "ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father." The God-man who lived in this world is no longer bound to the earth. He awaits us in heaven.

Our goal is to be one with Jesus and with the Father in heaven. But before we can get to heaven, we must undergo what Jesus underwent. We must live our baptismal commitment and carry our cross. We accept our Good Friday to get to Easter Sunday and our final reward of heaven.

To join Jesus in his ascension to heaven is to go all the way with him in his life and his ministry. As St. Catherine of Siena says, " Nothing great was ever done without much enduring, the more afflictions for Jesus in this world, so much the glory of Christ in the future."

The Ascension also reminds us of our mission. With Jesus returning to the Father, our share of the mission now begins. We are being sent out "to go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." We proclaim how much God loves us. We bear witness to what God does for us. We go in the name of Jesus to the poor, the lonely, and the abandoned. We go to those in need of God's mercy, forgiveness, presence, and love.

Next weeks readings Acts 2:1-11; Galatians 5: 16-25; John 20:19-23 PENTECOST

It is only in the Acts of the Apostles and St John's Gospel that there is any account of Pentecost which we celebrate next week. The gospel writings of Matthew, Mark and Luke do not in any way describe the coming of the Spirit and the two accounts that we have in Acts and John's Gospel differ quite considerably and yet, together, give us a very real picture of what the presence of the Spirit is about.

In the first reading for next week, Luke's Pentecost recorded in the Acts of the Apostles takes place 50 days after Jesus' resurrection. It uses imagery of wind, noise and fire to give us a startling picture of minds and hearts being first cleared of the chaos caused by fear, doubt, and cowardice and then seared with the love, wisdom and courage of God's Holy Spirit - *"all of them were filled with the Holy Spirit."*

John's gospel gives a much simpler Pentecost story. He has Pentecost taking place on Easter Sunday night when Jesus simply appears in the middle of the disciples hidden away for fear of the Jews, breathes on them and says to them, *"Receive the Holy Spirit..."*

But John's gospel reading for Pentecost Sunday this year is actually taken from Jesus' farewell discourse at the Last Supper and spells out what disciples of Christ can expect from the Holy Spirit at work in their lives - *"when the Spirit comes, he will guide you into all the truth...."*

Paul uses his letter to his Galatian community to expand on what that 'truth' is and what the guidance of the Spirit will lead them (and us) to - *"...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."*
