# WHANGANUI PARISH BULLETIN 10 JUNE 2018 10TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**Readings for this week:** Gen 3:8-15 2 Cor 4:13-5:1; Mark 3:20-35

The First Reading we have today from the Book of Genesis is essential to our understanding and articulation of how God has been revealed to humanity. The story of Creation and the Fall, while not a scientific textbook, is inspired Scripture which tells us the truth about humanity's relationship with God and his plan for its salvation after our first parents who chose to rebel by choosing what is evil instead of adhering to what is good.

Since most of us are Gentiles we have been grafted, though baptism, onto the olive tree that is the Jews who were the original Chosen People and remain as such: "... for the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable." (Rom 11: 29) St Paul says: "For if you (the Gentiles) have been cut from what is by nature a wild olive tree and grafted contrary to nature, into a cultivate olive tree (the Jews) how much more will these natural branches be grafted back into their own olive tree (converted to Christ)." (Rom 11: 24) It is a complete error to think that we can find a foundation for our faith in a "new cosmology" or on the basis of some other foundational myth, whether Asian, Maori or European. We cannot, likewise, think of them as all having equal value or meaning.

The work of evangelisation is to unite the whole of humanity in the one family of faith which includes the understanding of our origins.

Thus, the Church: "Through her work, whatever good is in the minds and hearts of men, whatever good lies latent in the religious practices and cultures of diverse peoples, is not only saved from destruction but is also cleansed, raised up and perfected unto the glory of God, the confusion of the devil and the happiness of man. " (*Lumen gentium*, 17)"

# **ELEVENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR** Next weeks readings: Ezekiel 17:22-24 II Corinthians 5:6-10 Mark 4:26-34

Does it ever occur to us that Jesus had a dream, a dream which he invited his followers to share? The evangelists tell us Jesus began his public ministry by proclaiming, "The kingdom of God is close at hand!" And therein lies the dream - God fully active and effective in every human life. When Jesus talks about his Dream, he often uses images of growth. In next week's gospel reading, he describes the kingdom of God as seed scattered on the ground, growing slowly "without the sower knowing how". He goes on to expand the comparison, describing the Kingdom of God as a mustard seed, "smallest of all the seeds on earth", gradually growing into a large bush, "the greatest of all shrubs......[with]....large branches....[where].....the birds of the air can make nests in their shade". Jesus is making the point that, when it comes to the Kingdom of God, things generally happen slowly and quietly and that's something that requires patience - as St Paul says, "we walk by faith, not by sight". In other words, anyone with a dream has to be fully committed to living what is dreamed right from its smallest beginnings to its final fulfilment.

More than five centuries before Jesus talked of the Kingdom, Ezekiel realized that dealing with God meant being patient. In the first reading, he's talking to the people exiled in Babylon, hundreds of miles from home and he describes the dream of returning to the Promised Land using the same kind of imagery as Jesus did to describe the coming of the Kingdom of God.

As the Psalm tells us, it is God's steadfast love and faithfulness that will help us to do our part in growing the kingdom so that we "flourish like the palm tree".
