Readings for this week: Wis 1.13-15; 2.23-24 2 Cor.8.7,9 13-15 MK 5:21-43

Three elderly friends who were discussing what they would like people to say about them during their funeral. The first one said he would like to hear people say that he was a successful man. The second one said he would like to hear people say that he was a good man. The third one said: "I would like to hear people say, 'Look! His hand moved! He is alive!!!"

The Sunday's Gospel (Mark 5: 21-43), we hear how Jesus raised a little girl from the dead. What a joy it must have been for Jairus and his family that his daughter came back to life! They thought she was forever gone, but she had come back to them. Don't we wish that Jesus were alive today so that He would bring back to life a loved one who has died?

Anyone of us who is sick, or have loved ones who are sick, don't we all wish that Jesus were here with us physically so that He could heed our plea, the way He instantly healed the woman who had been afflicted with a hemorrhage for 12 years? Don't we all wish He would be here still and just help us with our problems, trials, issues and concerns? Don't we all wish He were with us right now to help us heal our ailing relationships, and heal the world with peace? Well, Jesus is not with us physically now, but His message is still with us: "Do not be afraid, just have faith."

Just have faith. This is a difficult message to bring to a world that operates on facts, figures and fortunes. Try telling "just have faith" to a businessman, or to a politician, or to those who have money and power in their hands. It is a message they will be hard put to relate to or understand. Of course, sooner or later they will. In fact, we all will --- when we become weak, helpless and desperate, and realise that nothing and no one can heal and save us except our God. What makes us not realise our need for God is our pride, our stupid pride and foolish pride. But it's not yet too late.

JUST HAVE FAITH. Amen...

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

Next weeks readings: Ezekiel 2:2-5 II Corinthians 12:7-10 Mark 6:1-6

How easy it is to misjudge, underestimate, or even completely dismiss someone, missing out on all they have to offer, simply because we think we already know that person and their background. That, in a nutshell, is the story of Mark's gospel reading next week.

Jesus comes home to Nazareth. He'd lived there for the best part of thirty years so, naturally, the people thought they knew him well. But he'd left Nazareth as a carpenter, and now he returns as a teacher, a healer and an advocate for justice for the oppressed. The gospel suggests that the townspeople could not accept this growth and change, this response to the call of God, so they rejected him and the truth and wisdom of his teaching. - *"What is this wisdom that has been given to him? Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary..... And they took offence at him."* The image they had of Jesus was a block to their learning more about him and his message.

Perhaps there's a lesson in that for us. Is it possible that we can form such strong opinions on the basis of past religious teaching and practices that, even when the evidence calls for change, we cling to the past? Is it possible that, in refusing to change, we miss out on recognising God's loving presence in our lives and the richness and challenge that presence brings? Is that what Mark is trying to tell us when he has Jesus say next week, *"Prophets are not without honour, except in their home town, and among their own kin, and in their own house"*? Is he reminding us of what we are in danger of missing out on when he continues, *"And Jesus could do no deed of power there and he [Jesus] was amazed at their unbelief"*?
