- 1.4 Orienteering symbols used to represent a course are identified.
- 1.5 Thumbing the map follows ground progress.

#### element 2

Relate map to ground features and ground to map features.

Range: may include but is not limited to – park, school, campus, streets.

#### performance criteria

2.1 Course is completed individually and within the set time.

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2.2 Control points are visited in the specified sequence.

#### element 3

Demonstrate responsible environment and safety practices.

#### performance criteria

- 3.1 Environmental care requirements are identified and demonstrated following the New Zealand Environmental Care Code.
- 3.2 Course safety procedures are described and demonstrated.

meeting points.
