Pastoral Reflections

Be Still

Since I was first appointed to
Westlake UMC, I have held regular
meetings with staff. As a group we gather to
pray together, plan together, and share how

we are faithfully working to make and mature disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Each meeting begins with some type of devotion. Recently we kicked off the meeting with a time of sharing our personal anchoring Scripture verses. I have many favorite passages from the Bible. One of our staff shared a verse that has long been one of my beloved passages, Psalm 46:10, "Be still, and know that I am God!"

Lately, I have been thinking a lot about this concept of being still. The concept makes sense; however, the reality is we live in a society that is filled with 24x7 constant motion. Our church is also a very busy place of worship, faith formation, and service. Indeed it has been a very busy past twelve months in the life of Westlake United Methodist Church. Many individuals have worked tirelessly to follow God's leading in meeting the strategic goals for the church that were established during last year's Charge Conference season. There will always be more work for us to do in the name of Jesus Christ. That being said, we cannot be the church God calls us to be if each of us are not caring for ourselves spiritually. "Be still, and know that I am God" is an important message for all of us.

Recently, my colleague Rev. Chip Freed tweeted, "The #1 sign that you are deteriorating spiritually is when you are satisfied where you are spiritually." Chip's tweet is an important reminder that we can never say, "I have grown enough in my faith" or "Me and Jesus are just fine." It is easy to be pulled into the non-stop busyness of your family, your work, and yes, even in the faithful work of the church. That is why we must create the space to be fed spiritually, not just on Sundays, but every day of our lives.

There are many ways to create that space to be with God. Each of us needs to find the techniques, tools, and spiritual disciplines that work for us. Sitting in a quiet chapel is critical to my spiritual well-being. That practice may not feel authentic to you. That being said, journal writing works for others but does not routinely feed me spiritually. What works for one person does not necessarily work for another. What is important is that we fine spiritual practices that draw us closer to God and use them regularly.

As I have shared before, I meet regularly with a spiritual director. It is a spiritual practice that continues to help me grow in my relationship with God. Often my spiritual director plays a sung or chanted reading of Psalm 46:10. Not too long ago she asked me to imagine that Jesus was looking directly into my eyes. Her assignment for me was to identify what I saw in Jesus' eyes as I pictured Him looking at me. I must confess, at first it felt a little uncomfortable. Over time I saw laughter, sadness, and love all





LECTIONARY BASED SUNDAY SCHOOL STARTS THIS FALL

Each week our preK through 7th graders will be focusing their Sunday School learning on a passage of



scripture that is from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL). The RCL is built around the seasons of the Church year which reflect the life of Christ. The use of a schedule of reading through the Bible in conjunction with the church year has been in place for centuries. In 1992, a wide group of mainline churches in the U.S. and Canada came together to create the Revised Common Lectionary.

So what does this mean for us at Westlake UMC? Now the whole church will be hearing the same scripture and, on most Sundays, our pastors will be preaching on the same lesson the kids are learning. The intergenerational church family will be able to share their Sunday church experience in new ways!

But will it be fun? We've chosen Spark Lectionary for our curriculum. Sparkhouse, the publisher, has been refining their lectionary curriculum for many years and offers lots of activities to help kids relate the age old story to their world. Kids will have a framework from which to understand the story of Jesus and experience many stories of our faith as the lectionary cycles through the Bible in 3 years.

Where in the Lectionary cycle will we start? We are in RCL year B, in the end of the season of Pentecost. We will have many lessons of Jesus from the Gospel of Mark. The church year actually ends in November with Christ The King Sunday. Then it starts over again with year C starting on the first Sunday of Advent.


