Pastoral Reflections

I was in my late 20s and going through major life changes when I came back to church. I started by going to United Methodist Churches because that's where I had been raised and confirmed. I would slip into the last row, sing and pray, and listen.

Then, I would sneak away to my car before the postlude had started.

When I moved to Ohio City on Cleveland's Westside, I began searching for a more permanent church home. That's when I realized that there weren't any United Methodist Churches near me. I was so surprised! How could there not be a UMC close to me?

There were two close to me according to my internet searches (which meant there were several smaller churches I didn't find.) I ended up at one of those and the rest, they say, is history.

Except it isn't really. This experience and reality has stayed with me and has remained on my heart ever since I decided to follow God's calling in my life. How could it be that one of the world's largest denominations had left such a huge area without churches?

During the same season I was looking for churches where I felt like I could be authentic and build a community. Since those are pretty intangible, I developed 5 "rules" for my church shopping project –

- 1. I need to be able to wake up without an alarm and still be on time;
- 2. I needed to be able to bring coffee into the service;
- 3. I needed to be able to wear jeans;
- 4. The music had to be good, and non-traditional;
- 5. And, the theology needed to be progressive, womenaffirming, and match my UMC-groomed understanding of scripture.

In this search, I also discovered that I couldn't get all five of those things in the same church. If I wanted #5 (which, to be honest, was the most important), I had to sacrifice at least #4 if not also 1-3. And in order to get 1-4, I had to sacrifice #5. As much as the lack of UMC's I could find, the fact that I couldn't find all five of these things in one place was a second shock.

When I joined a nearby UMC, I did end up finding all 5, but I was frustrated by how far I needed to go to get to church.

Thus began my passion project for creating worship communities for young people in the up-and-coming Cleveland near-westside neighborhoods and downtown. My involvement with Bread on Bridge, our new Tuesday evening worship service at the Nehemiah Mission, is an outgrowth of this passion. And this passion is one of the reasons I was invited to be part of the team at Westlake as we build a second site at Simpson Metro West.

The work of building something for young people is personal and I've realized that I'm not alone. There are a lot of young people in that area who are looking for a place to connect with (continued pg. 2)





MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT: OCTOBER 15 – DECEMBER 7

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid, CMS informs us that part of a healthy lifestyle is choosing our healthcare insurance wisely. This applies to choosing a Medicare plan that is right for you. Medicare's annual Open Enrollment period is a good time to review your current coverage to decide if there may be a better fit based on changes to current plans, your budget or health care needs.

Open Enrollment is when you can enroll in or make changes to your Medicare health plan or prescription drug plan: this means your Medicare Advantage or Medicare Part D plans. Your coverage begins January 1, 2019

Here are a few steps to follow to be a Healthcare Advocate for your Medicare:

- 1. Review the current plan notice. The "Annual Notice of Change" letter and plan information is mailed to you by September 30. This is where the plan tells you about changes to what the plan will cover.
- 2. Think about what is most important to you. Plans change their coverage each year, and so can your health needs change.

- 3. Do you qualify for help paying for Medicare? Ask and learn about the Medicare Savings programs that help with paying Medicare premiums, deductibles, and copayments. The Extra Help program provides assistance with Medicare prescription drug costs.
- 4. Shop for a plan that meets your needs and your budget.
- 5. Understand your Medicare options; seek assistance from an OSHIIP certified counselor.

Be your own Healthcare Advocate when choosing your Medicare coverage.


