WHANGANUI PARISH BULLETIN 14 OCTOBER 2018 28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Readings for this week: Wis 7:7-11 Heb 4:12-13 Mk 10:17-30

A priest who, upon starting the Mass, looked at the congregation made up of rich people and said to himself: "Lord, where are the poor?" After the Mass, when the collection had been counted, he said to himself: "Lord, where are the rich?"

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus underlines the difficulty of the rich to enter the kingdom of heaven because of their attachment to and reliance on their wealth. *"How hard it is for those who have wealth"* (Mk 10: 23). Money in itself is not bad. What is bad is filthy money, and unshared money. Take a look at what we have and what we have accumulated. Can we justify these when we come before God?

Use our money for our salvation, not for our condemnation. Those people who hurt or cheated others to acquire money have a lot of explaining to do before God. Those who use their money to hurt or take advantage of other people also have a lot of explaining to do. And those who did not share their money to the many suffering people around them also have a lot of explaining to do.

"Be still and know that I am God" (Ps. 46, 10). For us who are experiencing poverty and deprivation of any sort, let us be consoled that we have a generous and loving Father who assures us that He will not abandon or forsake us. God will provide! To those who are so engrossed in making more money, to the point of making money their "god," listen to the Lord today. Let not money be our "god." God is God. Don't be a slave to money because God is our Master!!!

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

Next weeks readings: Isaiah 53:10-11 Hebrews 4:14-16 Mark 10:35-45

If you remember there have been two previous Sundays when the gospel reading from Mark has challenged us to think about what it really means to 'die with Christ'.

Next week we are going to be challenged a third time to consider what it means. On the twenty fourth Sunday Mark's Jesus described the dying he wanted from his followers as being open to whatever God asks for. On the twenty fifth Sunday accepting even the community's most insignificant members as being important was the second kind of dying involved in discipleship.

Next week, Mark's Jesus takes us one step further in understanding what 'dying with Christ' really means. Proving that they've totally missed the point of what Jesus has been saying, the brothers, James and John, rather blatantly ask for the plum positions in Jesus' kingdom – *"Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory"*. In response, Jesus outlines his dream of an authority structure which completely turns the structures familiar to them upside down.

"You know that among the gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them.....are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant.....must be slave of all."

Being always alert for and open to God's call, accepting and respecting every other human being as our equal in Christ, and being absolutely committed to serving others, is what following Christ is all about.

Pope Francis says, "The message of Jesus always challenges worldly religious power, and provokes consciences.....His message is upsetting, and it upsets us we have to convert, to change mentalities, to stop thinking the way we did before."
