Sunday 11 November

Start at dawn and join in the whole day, or select from the day's events and activities.

At 6.00am three pipers will play at the Tunnellers' Memorial at Gilmour Reserve. You will have time for breakfast before the Peace Train leaves from Waihi Station at 8.15am, returning to Waihi in time for morning tea at the Waihi RSA at 9.30am. There will be a church service at the RSA run by Waihi Salvation Army at 10.30am. At 11 o'clock—the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month—the church bell will toll eleven times. This will be followed by two minutes' silence, and a Waihi Memorial RSA service.

Groups and organisations around the country are being encouraged to join in the nation-wide 'Roaring Chorus'. Our 'Roaring Chorus' will take place as we parade to the Waihi Memorial Hall.

The events in the hall start at midday. They include the reading of a Roll of Honour, an address by Dame Margaret Bazley, and the sharing of community stories. The Waihi Lions Club will present named poppies to descendants of those whose names are on the Poppy Fence. This will be followed by recognition that this is also the 60th birthday of the Waihi Memorial Hall. To close, light refreshments will be provided by Waihi Lions Club.
