Readings for this week: Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11; Luke 5:1-1

Last week and this week we have been privileged to hear again the stories of the call of the prophets Jeremiah and Isaiah. Jeremiah learned that before God formed him in the womb He had been chosen and appointed to be a prophet to the nations. Isaiah was caught up in a vision of the all-powerful God enthroned in heaven surrounded by the seraphim, singing "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts the whole earth is full of his glory." After being cleansed from his sins Isaiah heard God's call, "Whom shall I send, who will go for us?" and responded in the well known words, "Here I am, send me!"

I always find myself rejoicing at the willingness of these two prophets indeed of all the prophets to take up the challenge implicit in the call and to speak and act so that the voice of the Lord was heard. Prophets faced enormous challenges as did Christ at Nazareth as we heard last Sunday.

Simon Peter was filled with a great sense of unworthiness after hauling in a huge catch after a night of fruitless fishing. We should not be surprised if we feel a sense of unworthiness when we hear the Lord's voice inviting us to follow a certain path in life. Nor should we forget the immense privilege in being asked to undertake any particular work in life – always remembering it is for the building up of the Church and the mission of the Church. We may be the only person invited to a particular task, such is the confidence God reposes in us.

And we should not think necessarily that a call comes only in the important decisions of life; to get married, to have another child, where to work, to respond to a call to religious life or the priesthood. The invitation to follow Christ's will may come in a conversation with a friend, to go and visit a sick person, to give extra to the Church's charitable works, to invite someone to join the family holiday. These sorts of things can and will work in the overall plan of God for us, our friends and acquaintances, teammates and workmates. You may not know until years later, as I have learned so often, what was the effect of following the impetus of the Holy Spirit.

SIXTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

Next weeks readings Jeremiah 17:5-8; I Corinthians 15:12, 16-20; Luke 6:17, 20-26

Next week there are three strong readings to think about.

The Gospel reading can give the impression that Luke's Jesus is condemning anyone who has money, material wealth, a sense of humour and a good reputation while blessing those who are poverty-stricken, with no material possessions, no joy in life and the object of other's scorn.

The prophet Jeremiah seems to speak in an equally harsh manner about trusting human beings and thus turning away from God.

So do we have to believe that those of us who have plenty of money, those of us who are able to eat well, those of us who enjoy life, those of us with standing in society, have no place in the kingdom of God?

Or is what both Jeremiah and Jesus ask their followers to think about a matter of **attitude** – while not in need ourselves, being sensitive to and ready to respond to the needs of those not as well off as we are, enjoying our own lightheartedness but never failing to re-act with generosity and compassion to those weighed down with suffering and misery, using the standing and influence we might have in our community to seek justice and a better life for those who do not enjoy what we have.

St Paul tells us that living in the light of Christ's resurrection is what gives us real life.

It will enable us to think of others as well as ourselves, sharing our material benefits, our skills and our gifts with compassionate hearts and a commitment to mercy, justice and forgiveness. As Jeremiah says: "This tree does not fear when the heat comes.....in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit."
