WHANGANUI PARISH BULLETIN 24 MARCH 2019 3RD SUNDAY OF LENT



Readings for this week Exodus 3: 1-8a, 13-15; 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12; Luke 13: 1-9

Most of us have heard this famous Latin phrase, Deus caritas est, which mean God is love. It is even the title of the first encyclical of our previous Pope, Pope Benedict XVI.

But there is another phrase that is very much related to it, Caritas patiens est, which means Love is patient, this phrase is from the letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians. God is always true to his nature, he is love, his existence is love and if being patient is a property of love, then he is also the greatest example of being patient.

The gospel for this third Sunday of Lent, explains to us briefly, the patience of God, a loving Father who is willing to wait for his children. He is willing to give us all the assistance we need, so that we will be able to grow in our faith, to bloom and eventually bear fruit.

That patience of God also gives us an opportunity to encounter him. It gives us a chance to see that what we are following is not merely a set of rules, practise or law, but rather we are following and building up a relationship with the very person of Jesus.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI in his encyclical Deus Caritas est said, we have come to believe in God's love: in these words the Christian can express the fundamental decision of his life. Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction.

This third Sunday of Lent let us remember *Deus patiens est*! God is patient.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Next weeks readings: Joshua 5:9a, 10-12; Il Corinthians 5:17-21; Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Next week Luke has Jesus telling a Parable in response to the criticism of the Scribes and Pharisees – "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them."

A March 2019 Aotearoa New Zealand version of the parable might begin in a similarly derogatory way, e.g: "This crazy country welcomes Muslims and gives them homes and work."

The story of the Prodigal Son is one of our best-known and most-loved parables. Could it be that we are so taken up with the account of his dissolute living, his repentance and return home with the outpouring of fatherly love, forgiveness and rejoicing that we give little, if any, thought to the older brother and his reactions? The parable makes it clear that he allowed resentment, self-absorption and an exaggerated sense of personal entitlement to embitter him to the point of totally rejecting his brother.

Perhaps a parallel thought, as we follow the reading next week, might be: What possible sense of personal entitlement gives me, or any other resident of Aotearoa New Zealand, the right to resent the presence of our Muslim sisters and brothers, to deprive them of sharing the abundance and security of our country by callously shooting them down, causing those who survive to live in fear and anxiety?

Maybe the 2019 Aotearoa New Zealand version of the parable might end with an admonition to us similar to the one that ends the Prodigal Son: "Look, you are always with me and everything I have is yours. But we have to celebrate and rejoice, because these Muslim people, our sisters and brothers, are here to share the richness of their lives with us."


